

Aid Fund Code Naming Convention

The BSAC (**B**anner **S**tudent **A**id for **C**anada) Aid Fund Code consists of ten characters. In order to assist with Aid Fund selection for Institutional Awards, some characters have been given specific meaning.

The **first** character is the type of award (e.g. Scholarship, Bursary, Loan, etc) that the Aid Fund represents.

Current first character defined values:

A	Athletics
B	Bursary
C	Certificate
E	Employment
F	Fellowship
L	Loan
O	Other
P	Prize
R	Research Award
S	Scholarship
T	Travel

X	Generic ¹
Z	Custom ²

The **second** through **seventh** characters represent the Finance Fund Code (e.g. 210771, 226106).

The **eighth** character represents the Program Stage and, in case of R and W, whether the award is renewable. *Current eighth character defined values:*

C	In-Course
E	Entrance (Non-Renewable)
V	Convocation
R	Entrance (R enewable)
W	In-Course (R enewable)

The **ninth** and **tenth** characters represent one-up sequence³ numbers, used to further distinguish variants of a same Aid Fund Code or when there is an organization change.

Specific/Named Aid Fund Codes

Some currently defined examples:

B205268C00	Anonymous Bursaries in Law	[UNIV:BURS:INCR:NR]
B205605E00	Killam Bursary	[UNIV:BURS:ENTR:NR]
S200854C00	ANTJE GRAUPE PRYOR AWARD	[UNIV:SCHL:INCR:NR]
S206001R00	Irwin-Brennan Scholarships	[UNIV:SCHL:ENTR:R4]

If you want to create an Aid Fund Code for a non-renewable 'Keyfitz Entrance Scholarship' the following code would be created: **S226106E00**. "S" for Scholarship; 6-digit finance fund number; "E" for Entrance.

The 'D'Arcy M Doherty Bursaries' (in-course and entrance, non-renewable) would be coded as follows: **B201432C00** and **B201432E00** respectively.

¹ Aid Fund Codes starting with **X** are **generic** aid funds (characters 2-10 are free-form)

² Aid Fund Codes starting with **Z** are **custom** aid funds (characters 2-10 are free-form)

³ A sequence usually starts at 0 and is incremented by +1 each iteration. After 9, use A, B, C, etc. (except for I, L and O to avoid confusion)

Generic Aid Fund Codes

Currently at McGill, students do not apply for "specific/named" awards but apply for generic financial aid (entrance scholarship, bursary, loan, etc.). It is therefore necessary to create "generic" non-disbursable aid fund codes which are then split/assigned to disbursable "specific/named" awards.

To easily identify these "generic" aid funds it has been decided that the **first** character would be represented by the letter "X", with the remaining nine characters being user defined (free-form).

Some examples:

- **1st char of aidtype/_/Prov or 'Area'/ pgmstage/aidtype** abbreviated if awarded by constituency
 - X_ON_ENSCH Generic Ontario Entrance Scholarship
 - X_OS_ENBUR Generic Overseas Entrance Bursary
 - X_QC_ENSCH Generic Quebec Entrance Scholarship
 - X_US_ENBUR Generic USA Entrance Bursary
- **1st char of aidtype/_/pgmstage/aidtype** (if no splitting by constituency)
 - X_INCRBURS Generic In-Course Bursary
 - X_INCRLOAN Generic In-Course Loan

Customized Aid Fund Codes

There may be cases whereby for "specific/named" awards you wish to deviate from the standard coding convention noted above. In this instance, it is recommended that the code be prefaced with the letter "Z".

This will be used primarily for Fee Deferrals, some examples are:

Z_FD_GA_AB Fee Deferral based on aid from AB
Z_FD_GA_BC Fee Deferral based on aid from BC
Z_FD_GA_MB Fee Deferral based on aid from MB
Z_FD_GA_NS Fee Deferral based on aid from NS

It has also been decided that the "2nd" character in customized Aid Fund Codes for non-disbursable awards would be defined as the follows:

K	Book
M	Medal
Etc...	

For example, the Governor General medals (Gold for graduate studies and Silver for undergraduates) do not have a fund code since the medals are provided by the Governor General's office. The first 2 characters would be 'ZM' and characters 3-10 are free form. These could possibly be coded as:

ZMGGG Governor General Gold Medal
ZMGGS Governor General Silver Medal
